Club History

The Dorking Wanderers B Team showcases the best young talent within the club's academy and provides a first step into senior football.

The B Team is managed by Charlie Dunne, alongside Head Coach Simon Ray and coaches Eric Benedetto and Will Lonsdale.

Its players progress into the B Team after completing their journey through the age groups of the Elite Section from U7 to U16.

Squad members also play for our National League Academy A side, as well as competing in the FA Youth Cup.

The B Team is overseen by Head of Football, Rob Tuvey, and Director of Education & Football, Jordan Clark, who lead the club's pathway.

As the club strives to develop first team players, the B Team is provided with a supportive environment and high calibre coaching. As testament to their hard work, players have been awarded with scholarships and first team contracts in past seasons.

Having previously played in suburban leagues, Dorking Wanderers Reserves - as they were then known - joined the Combined Counties Football League Division One before the 2018-19 season.

After steady progress in senior football, the team transferred to the SCFL Division One in the 2021-22 season. They retained the 'Reserves' element of their name for that season before adopting the name 'Dorking Wanderers B' in 2022-23.

The side finished 3rd in their first season in this division, and then backed this up with a 3rd-place finish in 2023-24 and a 4th-place finish in 2024-25. They were ineligible to compete in the play-offs on all three occasions due to the FA's regulations on the National League System (NLS), whereby reserve teams are not permitted to play any higher than Step 6.

Opposition Lowdown



Four things you should know about Dorking Wanderers B...

10-2 in their demolition of Cophorne on 27th December 2025, Wanderers became - to date - the only SCFL Division One side this season to score 10 goals in a single game.

Jake Lawrence (four) and Samuel-Elie N'Cho both netted hat-tricks.



67% of Dorking's points this season have been gained at home.

With five wins and four draws at the Meadowbank, they have the division's 13th-best home form. They have lost their last four on the road, meanwhile.



9 goals scored from 13 away matches this season, which makes Wanderers the lowest goalscorers on the road in the entire SCFL Division One.

Curiously, though, they scored eight goals in three away cup games this season.



18 different goalscorers this season, which represents the third-highest number of any SCFL Division One side.

Only Infinity (21) and Saltdean United (19) have enjoyed a greater spread of different threats during this campaign.

Our Story

Ringmer AFC was formed in 2020, when Ringmer FC and AFC Ringmer merged and moved onto a new 3G pitch behind King's Academy School.

Coming after Ringmer FC folded in 2018 and sold their ground, The Caburn, to property developers, the project to build the Caburn Community Ground and merge the two clubs on the new site was several years in the making.

Committee members, management and players from both clubs came together to forge a new structure, which would be guided by one clear Mission Statement. This has remained ever since, and reads as follows:

"Striving to become a sustainable asset of value to the wider community through first-class facilities, access, and opportunity for all. Proudly providing a high-quality level of football with a focus on developing a pathway for local players."

A copy of this Mission Statement is featured on a plaque outside the Caburn Community Ground clubhouse. We view this as our guiding principle to all work we do as a Club, shaping everything we do for the Ringmer community.

Since experiencing our first season in the strange conditions of Covid-19, Ringmer AFC has grown every year to encompass even more sides.

Today, the Club comprises four men's senior sides, two men's under-18 teams, a Ladies team, a Ladies Flex (Over-30s) side, a Ladies under-18 team, men's Veterans (Over-35s) and Masters (Over-45s) sides, and two men's Walking Football teams (Over-50s and Over-60s).

After regularly competing at the top of the Mid Sussex Football League (MSFL) Premier Division, including winning the 2023-24 title, we were delighted to achieve promotion last season to make this our first season in the Southern Combination Football League.

Our Predecessors' Stories:

Ringmer FC

Formed in 1905, Ringmer FC joined the Lewes & District League prior to WW1. Having reformed after the conflict, they secured their first trophy, the Sussex Junior Cup, in 1926.

The club moved onto its famous Anchor Field site after WW2, joined the Brighton League in 1951 and climbed the divisions to join the Sussex County League in 1963. The late 1960s and early 1970s then proved to be a golden age for the club, with rapid developments to The Caburn including a prefabricated building from the old Croydon Airfield. Results on the pitch reflected these improvements.

Ringmer were Division 2 champions in 1968/69 and then became the first village club to reach the FA Cup First Round Proper in 1970/71, where they lost 3-0 to eventual Quarter-Finalists, Colchester. Ringmer then won the club's only Sussex County League Division 1 title in 1971/72, and lifted the Sussex Senior Cup in 1972/73.

After an up-and-down period in the 1980s and '90s, the club had another bright spell in the mid-2000s. They won the 2005-06 RUR Cup and were runners-up in the Sussex Senior Cup. The Blues survived near-extinction in the 2008-09 season after going into administration. After relegation from the Premier Division and a failed attempt to get back into the top tier, they eventually folded at the end of the 2017-18 season.

AFC Ringmer

In 2004, local lads James Warren and Stephen Craig, set up AFC Ringmer, to give young local players disillusioned with the county set-up a chance to represent their village.

Their first season saw them crowned champions of the Mid Sussex Football League (MSFL) Division 5. They won Divisions 4 and 3 in the following two seasons, picking up the Somerville Cup along the way. The success did not stop under new managers Dan Merry and Sam Short, with the Division 2 title securing a fourth consecutive promotion. Oli Gibson then led the first team to the MSFL Premier Division in 2015-2016 and continued as manager until the merger.

Many of AFC Ringmer's players and managers have been instrumental parts of Ringmer AFC. Ian Linstrem and Mark Hutchings have served as chairs, legends Dave Manning and Brett Johnson continue in their Secretary and President roles, and Gibson is part of the first team coaching staff. Without the energy, hard work and dedication of many ex-AFC Ringmer personnel, the new club would have struggled to have the deep community impact it has.

A disappointing away day saw Ringmer come up short against 10-man East Preston in a 2-1 loss, reports Oscar Sullivan.

After an abandonment and a postponement, the Blues' third attempt to play this fixture ended in a poor performance.

Even before the game, the odds were stacked against Ringmer as captain Charlie Northeast was taken ill, adding to the absences of Ellis Webster and Lamin Sey (suspension), as well as Will Fenner and Tyreece Whiteoak (season-ending injuries).

The hosts took an early lead, before a contentious East Preston red card appeared to hand Ringmer a route back into the contest.

Despite the man advantage, Ringmer weren't able to capitalise. A second for East Preston in the second half ramped up the difficulty, and Ringmer's only goal came with the penultimate kick of the game through Lucas Sewell.

As the season enters its final weeks, things are coming nicely to the boil across the three divisions of the Southern Combination and giving everyone plenty to talk about.

This time last year, Ringmer were in a straight fight with Westfield for a place in the predominantly Sussex-based county league section and took their spot in Division One for this season.

I imagine most at the club would agree it's been quite the rollercoaster of a campaign, but one where most have learnt quite a lot about the level which stands them in good stead for next season. Safety isn't quite yet assured, but there are still plenty of games left to make it definite, and there is a lot for other clubs to do.

Either side of Ringmer, there is much interest to be taken note of, including one division above and those below. Whilst it might be a stretch for anyone to pip Godalming to the title, the play-off race is gathering momentum week upon week.

Billingshurst, Arundel, Infinity and Worthing United have all been there or thereabouts all year, but AFC Walcountians, who, like Ringmer, are in their first year in this division, and also Reigate Priory can't be discounted from the mix.

At the other end, there is no telling until after the season has finished whether two or three sides will be relegated, dependent on those wanting to come up being eligible and possible lateral movement across borders.

Last season, one side was relegated (Alfold), a second demoted on ground grading (Storrington) and a third taking a long step downwards (Montpelier Villa), so who knows the permutations this season.

Below, in Division Two, there is a fascinating three-horse race between Rustington, Hailsham Town and Chichester City B, who have all applied for promotion.

Across in the Mid Sussex Premier, it's appearing to be a straight shoot-out between Westfield and Crowhurst, who incidentally meet next weekend - a year on from the original Race to Step 6 - at the Knight & Davey Stadium.

The third side potentially comes from the Surrey Premier County Football League, which last season produced AFC Walcountians. Hopefully, there will be no reprieves, as Copthorne found themselves with one last year and have failed to kick on.

Whilst not much attention here is possibly paid to the top end of the Premier Division, there is a title race in action between Haywards Heath Town and Steyning Town, with Guernsey primed to pounce should either side slip up in the next six weeks. Their play-off places are looking very set and secure, and other teams would have to hope for the top three's form to drop off a cliff and maintain lightning pace in the run-in to steal a march.

The other end is the noticeable one for Division One clubs, and it's looking very much like relegation for two of three clubs; those being AFC Varndeanians, Shoreham and Lancing. If the latter fall, it will be a double dip relegation for the Culver Road outfit.

Shoreham's 20-odd game losing streak was snapped recently, but a 9-0 hammering at Haywards Heath last weekend was a big blow after stemming the flow of goals conceded. Varndeanians are the best of the bunch in their recent form.

The next six weeks or so will bring more than a few twists and turns for all three divisions, and plenty for us podcasters and writers to be keeping an eye upon!



How To Get There
